BJP's Historic Comeback: A Data-Driven Study of the 2025 Delhi Elections

An Analytical Study of BJP's Electoral Strategy, Voter Behavior, and AAP's Downfall

The **2025 Delhi Legislative Assembly Elections** were a **historic turning point** in the political trajectory of the national capital, marking the **return of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) to power after 27 years**. The election, held on **February 5, 2025**, saw the BJP securing **48 out of 70 seats**, decisively defeating the **Aam Aadmi Party (AAP)**, which had been in power for a decade.

This election was particularly significant because it signaled a **major shift in voter sentiment**, with **AAP losing 40 seats compared to the 2020 election**. The **BJP's performance improved drastically**, as it managed to **increase its vote share to 47.15%**, whereas AAP saw a **sharp decline to 43.57%**.

1. **Anti-Incumbency Against AAP**

2. **Modi Factor**

- PM Modi's rallies emphasized development, governance, and nationalism.
- His influence mobilized BJP's voter base.

3. **Booth-Level Management**

- Amit Shah's panna pramukh strategy strengthened grassroots outreach.
- 10 lakh booth workers ensured effective voter engagement.

4. IT and Social Media Strategy

- BJP's digital campaign countered opposition narratives.
- Hiren Joshi's team ensured real-time engagement via Twitter, YouTube, and WhatsApp.

5. Voter Demographics Shift

- Increased support from first-time voters and urban youth.
- Women voters backed BJP due to welfare schemes like free ration and PM Ujjwala Yojana.


2. Political Landscape Leading Up to the 2025 Election

2. Water Shortages & Infrastructure Neglect


- Several parts of Delhi, including **outer and semi-urban areas**, faced **severe water shortages** in 2024.

2.2 BJP’s Comeback Strategy & Political Momentum

As AAP struggled, BJP focused on a three-pronged strategy: **grassroots mobilization, Modi’s leadership, and digital dominance**.

A. Strengthening Booth-Level Presence

- Under **Amit Shah’s leadership**, BJP deployed the **panna pramukh model**, ensuring voter outreach at the booth level.
- Over **10 lakh booth workers** engaged in direct voter contact through door-to-door campaigns and local meetings.
- Targeted engagement in **key swing constituencies** helped BJP gain voter trust.

B. The Modi Factor – BJP’s Biggest Asset

Unlike 2020, PM **Narendra Modi actively campaigned** in 2025, leading multiple rallies and public meetings. His presence:

- Reinforced **pro-development and nationalist messaging**, resonating with youth and urban voters.
- Created a **contrast between BJP’s strong governance and AAP’s corruption scandals**.
- Mobilized **first-time voters**, a crucial demographic in Delhi’s evolving electorate.

BJP’s **digital dominance** played a key role in countering AAP’s narratives:


- **Hiren Joshi**, PM Modi’s IT strategist, led a **data-driven digital campaign**, ensuring real-time voter engagement.

B. Social Media Outreach












